
#### **Checklist for Freshers**

### To Do Immediately if you haven't already



## To do by 10 September

- Return your **College Contract** to <a href="mailto:admissions@hmc.ox.ac.uk">admissions@hmc.ox.ac.uk</a> (this will be issued once you have met all your conditions
- Return your **University Card Form** 
  - o Undergraduates should email their to admissions@hmc.ox.ac.uk
  - Postgraduates should return theirs to the location as instructed by their department.

#### To do before arriving in October

- Register with the **College Doctor** at <a href="http://www.campusdoctor.co.uk/oxford/">http://www.campusdoctor.co.uk/oxford/</a>
  - Please note that all students must register with the College Doctors unless they
    have particular reason why they need to remain registered with an alternative
    doctor during term time, in which case full contact details need to be provided to
    the College via the Members area (see below).
- Make sure you have had all the necessary **vaccinations.** 
  - o Details can be found in the letter under 'Medical' on the Freshers' Webpage.
  - For those coming from some countries, vaccinations may be a requirement if your visa.
- Complete student **pre-registration**.
  - You will be emailed via IT Services a User ID and login details for the Student Self-Service website (www.ox.ac.uk/students) once your returned University Contract has been processed.
  - o Until you have been fully registered you won't be able to access online resources or enrolment certificates which you may need for a variety of purposes.
- Activate your **University email address.** 
  - Please note that you will not be issued with login details and an activation code until your University Card form has been returned and processed.
- $\Diamond$  Add your details to the **HMC members area.** 
  - You should go to <a href="https://members.hmc.ox.ac.uk/">https://members.hmc.ox.ac.uk/</a> and click on the 'About Me' tab to complete all of your details.
  - o Please email admissions@hmc.ox.ac.uk when you have done this.
  - (Note, you will need your Oxford ID and login details to log into the members area).
- igtriangle Disclose any **long-term health conditions or disabilities** which may affect your studies.
  - Confidentiality and Disclosure Forms are available to download from the
     'Information for students with disabilities' section of the Freshers' Webpage.
  - o If you have a disability or health problem, and have not already disclosed it to the College then please do complete and return a form at the earliest opportunity. If you have any questions relating to disability or special needs then please contact the Disability Officer, Victoria Lill (academic.administrator@hmc.ox.ac.uk)

- Purchase your **academic dress** (gown and subfusc)
  - Please make sure that you have an academic gown and sub fusc in time for the
     Matriculation Ceremony on 14 October 2023: we are expecting that there will be an opportunity for formal photography on this day.
  - Details of what is required for sub fusc can be found in the 'Matriculation and Academic Dress' section of the Freshers' Webpage.
  - Please note that academic dress will also be required for formal meals (gowns only), examinations and graduation.
  - Further details regarding the arrangements for matriculation will be sent through in due course

#### Additional actions for International Students

- $\Diamond$  Make sure you have the appropriate **immigration documents**

  - Visas can take a long time to come through and so, if one is required, please apply at the earliest opportunity to allow plenty of time for your application to be processed.
