Signing in for meals in hall

All students are required to sign in for all meals other than breakfast and the deadline for doing so is 2.00pm the day before. To sign in please logon to https://meals.hmc.ox.ac.uk/. There is one exception which is the Welcome Dinner on Wednesday, 8th October.

For the Welcome Dinner please would you complete the webform available at <u>Freshers' Week Bookings</u> to confirm whether or not you would like to attend. The deadline for responses is **10:30 AM on Monday 6th October.** The dress code is smart (not black tie). In recognition of the fact that many of you won't yet have had the opportunity to buy an academic gown, gowns won't be compulsory for this dinner. However, those who have a gown are encouraged to wear them.

Registration (mandatory):

All freshers are required to register at the Academic Office. It is advised that you do this at the earliest opportunity as until you are registered you will not be able to access the University's online resources and in the case of those in receipt of a UK student loan registration triggers the release of funds.

In advance of registration you will need to have self-registered via Student Self Service (www.ox.ac.uk/students) and for this you will need to have received your Single Sign-on. For those who were not issued a University Card on arrival will be able to collect theirs during registration. The Academic Office can be found on the first floor of the main building and will be open 9am-3.45pm Monday-Friday. If you haven't yet received your SSO then please contact admissions@hmc.ox.ac.uk. To arrange a time to register and collect your University Card please book here. If you are a visa holder then please see the note below.

Visa holders

All freshers on a visa (including those with Settled or Pre-Settled Status) will be contacted by the Academic Office to provide scans of passports, and Share Codes for the gov.uk website (see https://www.gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status for further details). We will not be able to register you until these have been received. This applies to all fulltime students who are not UK or Irish nationals and passport copies and share codes can be uploaded here.

MyOxford student app

Once you have received your SSO please download the MyOxford app. MyOxford is the official app for oncourse students at the University of Oxford. Designed to support you throughout your time at Oxford, the app provides quick and easy access to essential University systems and services.
